Coco and Jax are 12-year-old Persians who were adopted in 2015. They were recently returned because their owner had a lifestyle change and could no longer take care of them. Given their age, we felt that a vet check-up and bloodwork were in order.

At the appointment, the vet discovered several issues. Jax is in the beginning stage of kidney disease and needs to have a dental where, most likely, all his teeth will be removed. Coco has stage 2 kidney disease, asthma and a heart murmur. She also needs a dental but will need an echocardiogram by a cardiologist before undergoing the procedure. Because of their kidney disease, both cats must be on a special diet for the rest of their lives.

As you can imagine, all of these procedures and the special food are expensive. Still, at West Suburban Humane Society, we make a lifelong commitment to the animals in our care. We always take them back no matter the reason and provide the necessary care to give them the best chance to live a happy, healthy life and find a new family.

We wouldn't be able to provide above-and-beyond care to animals like Coco and Jax without the contributions of our generous supporters. Your donation allows us to continue our life-saving work of helping animals in need.

he Sunday afternoon kennel shift is always open to new volunteers because they know that more people equal more time outside for the dogs. Rechelle Reyes, shift coordinator, also believes that everyone should aim for their "yellow dot" status so that they can take the dogs off property. More people, more walks, more time outside is their recipe for a kennel full of happy pups!

The shift has almost 30 years of WSHS experience between them, from veterans Rechelle Reyes and Sarah Moylan to Katherine Musto, Marni Pyke and Maddie Frankie, who have several years under their belts, to newcomers Neill Tabotabo and Ed and Eli Piotrowski. They all get along well together and always put the dogs first. Their goal is to give every dog more than 30 minutes away from its kennel on a Sunday afternoon. Sarah recognizes that everyone on the shift really cares about the dogs and wants them to have fun.

Spending lots of time with the dogs allows these volunteers to learn more about behaviors of different dogs. Katherine knows that each dog has their own unique personality and looks forward to learning all about them. Sarah has learned that patience is crucial especially when working with new dogs that haven't settled in or rambunctious dogs that can get overly

excited in a kennel environment. Ed and Eli have increased their handling skills and know how to keep the dogs active and social in a safe way.

The team's enthusiasm for our animals has led them to volunteer in other areas of WSHS as well. Neill and Rechelle help at Barkapalooza each September. Sarah has also volunteered in the cattery on two other shifts, and Marni and Maddie spend their alternate weekends on a cattery shift too. Neill fostered two puppies in need this past year and ended up adopting one of them.

So, what keeps these volunteers coming back weekend after weekend? There's not just one answer. Rechelle has never had a dog in her family, so she comes here to get her dog fix with 20 of them. Katherine loves seeing the animals find their forever homes, knowing each of them is deserving of the best. Sarah says that taking the dogs out in groups to play always makes her laugh. Ed and Eli will always have a favorite in the kennel, and they look forward to seeing them the most. Eli will even spend time looking at the WSHS dogs online when he's not here. Marni and Maddie enjoy everything about their time at the adoption center, from the cute and cuddly puppies to the shy cats and scared dogs. Getting a cat to purr or a dog to wag their tail warms their hearts.
