Or 6 tickets for \$25.00, giving you 1 free ticket! Or 15 tickets for \$50.00, giving you 5 free tickets!



## Pet Health Watch by Dr. Main, DVM

In this warm weather, can my dog overheat?

The summer months are a high risk period for dogs to overheat. When dogs overheat and become sick it is called heat stroke. In general, dogs do not tolerate the heat very well. Outside temperatures of more than 85 degrees could be a hardship for many dogs. Abrupt changes in temperature can worsen the effect of heat on a dog. Dogs may require a period of 10-12 days to acclimatize to warmer weather.

True heat stroke can have devastating effects on the patient, including death. Risk factors include: obesity, long hair, overexertion, old age and a short nosed dog such as a Pug. Most cause of heat stroke involve exposure to extreme heat, confinement in an enclosed area, often with poor ventilation, and no access to water. For example when a dog is confined to a car on a hot day, he can overheat and develop heat stroke in a short time period.

How can one determine if their dog is developing heat stroke? Upon inspection of the dog, several things will be apparent. The gums will be very red, mental status will be dull or even stuporous, in addition, panting, salivating, vomiting and diarrhea and often collapse can be observed.

These patients are distressed and rectal temperature is over 106 degrees (normal is 101 degrees).

Heat stroke is a true medical emergency!

Heat stroke is the result of direct thermal injury to body tissues. Let's look briefly at what happens. As the core body temperature increases, the body begins to produce chemicals that stimulate inflammation. Both the thermal insult and the inflammatory insult begin to damage tissue, in particular the lining of blood vessels and the intestines. This cycle escalates very quickly, leading to the release of toxins from the gut and tiny clots in the vascular system and eventually swelling in the brain. The body simply deregulates and fails. This is a scary condition for any dog and its owner.

What can be done if a dog is overheating? One must act quickly, hopefully within 30 minutes. Cooling the patient is the most important initial treatment. This is accomplished by bathing the patient in cool water, starting room temperature intravenous fluids, using a fan and applying alcohol to the foot pads. The patient must only be cooled to 103 degrees, as the temperature will continue to drop from there. Beyond this initial care, patients may require oxygen therapy, drugs to maintain normal blood pressure, antibiotics to control

intestinal bacteria and many additional life support therapies. The use of ice in cooling the patient is not recommended because it may cause vasoconstriction and hence limit cooling.

This is a serious condition. Patients have a risk for death, and in that event, death usually occurs within 24 hours. On the other hand, if the patient improves over 48 hours, the prognosis is excellent.

General tips about heat stroke include limit exercise during periods of heat. If heat stroke is suspected, obtain a rectal temperature and start cooling the patient at home. Patients that have had heat stroke are more prone to recurrences. Lastly, provide shade, water and avoid confinement and poor ventilation.

Good luck this summer beating the heat with your pets. Remember always check the dryer for your feline companions. Cats can get heat stroke too.
