Downers Grove, IL – Nearly 1,500 beagles are beginning an incredible new journey—one filled with love, care, and new experiences. The West Suburban Humane Society (WSHS) is proud to be part of this life-changing national rescue effort, welcoming eleven beagles from a dog breeding and biomedical research facility in Blue Mounds, WI.

This marks the first step toward a life they've never known. For many of the beagles, it is the first time they will experience the simple joys of everyday life—feeling the warmth of the sun, going for walks, and receiving the care and affection of a family. The West Suburban Humane Society remains committed to ensuring each of these beagles is placed into a compassionate, permanent home where they can thrive.

“Our mission is about making sure these dogs go into loving homes,” said Carolyn Mossberger, Executive Director at WSHS, “We are honored to play a role in this national effort. Together we can give these beagles the happy and healthy lives they deserve.”

The heart of our work is centered on ensuring every animal finds a loving home, and these beagles are no exception. Each dog will receive comprehensive veterinary care, including spay/neuter procedures, vaccinations, and microchipping, along with daily enrichment, proper nutrition, and socialization.

Caring for these dogs requires significant resources, and community support will play a critical role in the care of these animals. Donations will directly fund medical treatment and ongoing care, helping ensure each beagle has the best possible start in their new life.

Importantly, WSHS is dedicated to giving these beagles the time, space, and patience they need to be ready for adoption. The outside world may be an overwhelming place, especially for any animal used to isolation or extreme conditions. Through the Foster Program, the beagles will have the chance to acclimate slowly to freedom and gently learn what it means to be in a loving home.
