our-week-old Sesame was in rough shape when he arrived at WSHS on a transport from Franklin County Animal Control. He was hungry, dehydrated, and covered in fleas. Our team immediately jumped into action. We gave him a warm bath, treated the fleas, and got some much-needed food into his tiny belly. He was then placed in a loving foster home to rest and recover.

But later that night, Sesame took a turn for the worse.

He became lethargic and refused to eat. His foster family didn't hesitate; they rushed him to the emergency vet, where Sesame was admitted for two days. He was suffering from dangerously low blood sugar, severe dehydration, and a low body temperature. It was a critical situation for such a fragile little life.

Thanks to swift medical care – and the unwavering compassion and commitment of our team and the foster family – Sesame pulled through. He's now back in foster care, healing day by day and starting to show the spark of a playful kitten again.

Sesame's emergency care totaled \$2,500, but we never turn our backs on an animal in need. Every kitten, every life, matters.

Sesame is just one of hundreds of kittens that come through our doors during kitten season – many requiring urgent or intensive care. Our mission is simple: provide above-and-beyond rescue care to the most vulnerable. But we can't do it alone.






Emails from Adopters

Mike consulted with our animal care team and came in outside of his shift to work with Midas before he went to board and train. Mike was able to understand why Midas was exhibiting certain behaviors and was able to help him regulate those behaviors.

Mike also went to other kennel shifts to help those volunteers work with Midas. The Tuesday evening shift coordinator was extremely appreciative of Mike's efforts, not only with Midas but with giving her yellow dot volunteers handling help and building their confidence with Midas.

Sam is an 11-year-old volunteer who works on Friday evenings in the cattery with his mom, Heather. There are two other volunteers on the shift with Sam, Heather, and the shift coordinator. There are enough volunteers on this shift that

Two weeks ago, one volunteer was scheduled to be absent when another volunteer called off last minute. In addition, Sam's mom was not able to come so Sam was bringing his dad.
