Attend our 5K Rescue Run, 1K Waggin' Tails Walk and Rescue Fest!

The 5K Rescue Run entry fees are as follows:

- \$35 June 6th through August 5th
- \$40 August 6th through September 1st
- \$50 September 2nd through September 28th

The 1K Waggin' Tails Walk entry is \$20 for an individual and \$30 for a family. The Rescue Fest entry is \$20 per car. Each family that attends will receive a Barkapalooza goody bag (while supplies last).

This past year we have been called to help animals with a variety of medical needs. Twyla, Muriel, Jellybean and June all had to receive heartworm treatment. Cow had a broken leg that needed to be repaired by a specialist. We are at the height of kitten season and have over 100 kittens in foster care. The kittens will need vaccines, spay/neuter surgery and microchipping before being adopted.

These are just some of the animals we've helped with the generous support of our donors. Our goal is to raise \$1,000,000 at Barkapalooza, all to benefit the animals in our care!

Volunteer Spotlight



he every-other Sunday morning cattery shift has a "divide and conquer" plan of attack with everyone covering a specific area in the cattery. Working independently doesn't stop them from checking in with each other to help and to catch up on their lives. This close-knit group has volunteered together for years. Marissa Rog, the newest member, has been on the shift for two years; Yasmin Nasim, Bree Abbas, and Katie Potts have volunteered for 4-5 years, shift coordinator Sue Cipra has 15 years of experience, and Diane Lyons is the veteran of the group with 33 years!

You can tell these volunteers are committed to WSHS because you will find every one of them here outside of this shift. Yasmin, Katie, Sue, and Diane all volunteer on another regular shift in the cattery or kennel. Marissa and Bree volunteer with our humane education program and at events.

For Bree and Katie, volunteering is a family affair. Both started volunteering with sons too young to come on their own. Those sons are now older teenagers with busy schedules, so the volunteering has transferred to younger siblings.

Sue, Diane, and Katie have brought volunteering home by fostering WSHS cats and dogs that cannot be adopted due to behavioral or medical issues. Diane has Brittany, a senior tabby cat, and Sue has Dart, a Malinois mix and queen of Sue's castle. Katie's family fostered Pitbull Esme for two years of hospice care, making an incredible difference in her life. Yasmin, Katie, and Bree have their own pets. Yasmin has a 13-year-old cat named Toby who is bigger than

Lulu, her 4-year-old Yorkie. Katie just adopted Lady, a 5-month-old kitten. Bree is mom to three adopted cats: Chi, a 7-year-old gray tabby, Kashi, a 7-year-old Maine Coon mix, and Oliver, a 3-year-old Siamese/ Bengal mix and WSHS alum.

These dedicated volunteers are not only passionate about animals; they are also passionate about the WSHS mission. Yasmin takes satisfaction knowing that she is part of a good cause. Marissa likes volunteering in the new facility and says that the building makes a big difference for our animals as well as our volunteers. Bree embraces the WSHS "above and beyond" mindset. She has seen cats come to WSHS needing extra care that some other shelters may not be able to give. It makes her heart happy when these animals recover and find homes of their own. Sue also acknowledges the incredible feeling when an animal that has been passed over for adoption, mostly due to behavior issues, finally goes home because of our volunteers' dedication.

The volunteers have learned lots about cat behavior and care while volunteering at WSHS. They are pretty much able to handle any situation, including medicating, handling snarly cats, and even bringing kittens down from the ceiling pipes. Just when they thought they had seen it all, they found a cat abandoned at the adoption center door one Sunday this past April. There was no staff onsite, so they secured the cat, set up a cage with food, water and supplies, and welcomed 2-year-old Bo to WSHS. (Bo has since been adopted!)



Hearty Thanks

The Gurrola Family had a lemonade stand and donated the proceeds of \$51.29 to the adoption center.

Lester School held a donation drive for WSHS. They collected 8 boxes of toys and cleaning supplies. They also donated \$50.

Holmes Primary School in Clarendon Hills read a book about a shelter dog. They wanted to celebrate their reading, so they collected "Pennies for Paws" to donate to WSHS. They raised and donated \$356.

Murphy School in Woodridge collected and donated food, toys and supplies for the animals at the adoption center.
